



# NEWPORT & CARISBROOKE COMMUNITY COUNCIL

## **List of decisions made virtually since Full Council meeting held on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2020**

### **Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> March 2020**

THAT, a donation of £1554 be made to IW Foodbank with the stipulation that the funds are to be used within the Newport & Carisbrooke area.

### **Monday 30<sup>th</sup> March 2020**

THAT, a donation of £2000 be made to IW Food Bank with the funds being taken from the Place Plan Budget.

### **Monday 4<sup>th</sup> May 2020**

THAT, Newport & Carisbrooke Community Council submit a Resilient Communities Fund application to SSEN on behalf of Sight for Wight.

### **Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> June 2020**

THAT, the Covid-19 Recovery budget assembled by Cllr Brodie and Cllr Jones-Evans be approved to be used towards activities or projects which support community recovery. The budget is assembled using projected excess funds from existing budget lines.

### **Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> June 2020**

THAT, South Street toilets be re-opened on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> June subject to satisfactory legionella results being received and the following measures and activities being carried out:

Additional Clean to take place in South Street toilets each day with all internal and external handles/railings also being wiped clean with each visit.

Hand Sanitizers to be fitted.

Opening Hours to be revised to open at 0830 and to be closed at 1800 to coincide closely with shop opening hours.

Reduction in Cubicles and Wall Gate Units availability to avoid being used next to each other where possible and therefore increase social distancing.

Appropriate Signage outlining these closures, social distancing requests, requests for one in one out to be observed where possible and also reminders about health and hygiene all to be installed.

#### Friday 12th June 2020

THAT, NCCC approve the memorandum of Understanding with IW Council and commit to the Highstreet Heritage Action Zone Project.

#### Thursday 9th July 2020

THAT, Carisbrooke and Seaclose toilets be re-opened on Saturday 11th July with the same cleaning arrangements and precautions in places as what has been instated in South Street toilets.

THAT, Downside, Victoria Rec and Clatterford play parks are to re-open on Saturday 11th July. Signage to be placed at all entrances to the parks consisting of the following advice:

- You are advised to wash your hands or use hand sanitiser before entering and after leaving.
- Observe government guidance for social distancing.
- If the park is crowded, do not enter if you cannot stay at a safe distance from others.
- Users should limit their time on equipment and in the play area if people are waiting to enter.
- You are advised to wipe equipment before and after use.
- Do not allow children to touch their faces, put their mouths on equipment or put their hands in their mouths.
- Make sure you cough or sneeze into a tissue or use your arm if no tissue available.
- Consumption of food or drink in the playground area is prohibited.

- Please dispose of all litter in the litter bins provided or take any rubbish home  
Please note: Newport & Carisbrooke Community Council do not regularly clean the equipment.

#### Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> July

THAT, a donation of £2000 is made to Newport Fire Station for the purchase of replacement and additional Christmas lights. The donation to be taken from the Christmas & Festive Lights budget.

THAT, Newport & Carisbrooke Community Council unreservedly opposes proposals within the IW Councils draft Newport Harbour Masterplan to build housing on Seaclose Park. We recognise the importance of retaining green space in the town for our residents to enjoy.

THAT, public meetings of Full Council are to be resumed as of Monday 13<sup>th</sup> September. If guidance at the time permits then the meeting will be held in person, however if not permitted then the meeting will take place publicly using digital conferencing.

#### Friday 17<sup>th</sup> July

THAT, the Pavilion be re-opened for Bookings as of 10<sup>th</sup> August with the relevant government guidance being implemented and adhered to.

#### Monday 20<sup>th</sup> July

THAT, NCCC contribute £1,199 from the school crossing patrol budget to support a potential new patrol outside Medina House School.

#### Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> July

THAT, to proceed with the Post Office Lane toilet development a decision on which landscaping quotation is required. I propose accepting the quotation from Emerald Construction, being the cheapest and complying with the approved plans.

#### Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> August

THAT, NCCC provide a letter of support for a bid to provide electric vehicles available for lease on the Isle of Wight.

#### Friday 7<sup>th</sup> August

THAT, During the period where physical meetings of the Council are not taking place and remote meetings are necessary due to Covid-19 restrictions and social distancing measures are in place, it may mean that a councillor through no fault of their own, perhaps due to illness, equipment failure, internet connection problems or a mixture of all- finding themselves unable to attend a meeting for a period approaching six months. To avoid disqualification, the council is asked to pre-approve any councillor for an automatic two month extension of absence, immediately before they reach the six-month point. The reason for failure to attend would be recorded as circumstances arising from the Covid-19 pandemic.
